

# Cullman Count Bicentennial Student Art Competition and Showcase



The Cullman County Bicentennial Committee is seeking artists to participate in an exhibition of local community artworks, April 24-May 24, 2018, at the Burrow Center at Wallace State Community College, in conjunction with the Making Alabama traveling exhibition.

## **Exhibition Description**

For the Cullman County Bicentennial Student Art Competition and Showcase, participants are encouraged to submit artwork based on some aspect of Alabama – its people, places, stories, symbols, flora, fauna, etc., however, the subject matter is not limited to this theme. Any imagery and subject matter which inspire participants is welcome.

**<u>Categories</u>** Students are invited to submit drawings, paintings, multimedia works.

#### Age Divisions

Grades K-12, and Community College. Each grade will be judged separately.

## **Eligibility**

Eligible artists are current students in the Cullman City and County School System and home school-aged children, as well as Wallace State students. Home-schooled students should enter under their appropriate grade level. Each artist may individually submit a total of two artworks. Only original works of art will be accepted.

#### Awards

**1<sup>st</sup> Place - \$100**. 2<sup>nd</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> Places will be recognized with ribbons. Each grade will be judged individually with one first place award given per grade, along with second and third place awards.

#### **General Rules**

Entries must be original drawings, paintings, or multimedia artworks. Each entry must be the work of only one individual. **Deadline for submission of all artworks is April 24, 2018**. Artworks should be submitted to the Burrow Center at Wallace State (Wallace State Art Department), or to the Cullman County Museum. Any schools needing to make other submission arrangements should contact Adrian Scott, Wallace State Art Department Faculty, at 256.352.8145, or the Burrow Museum Reception Desk at 256.352.8457. The Bicentennial Committee requests that all artworks remain on display until May 25.

### **Presentation**

All entries should be ready and suitable for display when submitted.

Exhibition Artist Reception and Awards Ceremony will be held in the Burrow Center for the Fine and Performing Arts on **Monday, May 14 at 6 p.m**. All winners will be notified in advance but placement will not be announced until the awards ceremony. Exhibition participants, families and the public are invited to attend.

State Nickname - Yellowhammer State

**State Flag -** The official state flag of Alabama is called the "crimson cross of St. Andrew's," a red cross on a white background. This flag was adopted in 1895, and was patterned from the Confederate Battle Flag. This flag can be any type of rectangle (even a square) but the crimson bars must be six inches wide.
